



## Mr. Henry Martin Emineth

April 18, 1929 - May 9, 2020

Henry Martin Emineth, 91, of Tallahassee, passed away peacefully on Saturday, May 9, 2020, at his home, while surrounded by his loving family.

The third of nine children, he was born in Emmons County, North Dakota, on April 18, 1929, to the late John V. and Angeline Marie Gerhardt Emineth. Four of his siblings, Anna Marie, Stephen, Edward and William, lost their lives in a house fire on February 6, 1945.
