Judith Ann Foster passed away on May 7, 2024, in Tallahassee, Florida. She was born March 29, 1952, in Bremerton, Washington. She relocated to Tallahassee in 1961.

Ms. Foster graduated from Leon High School, where she was a member of the chorus and the Madrigals. She attended Florida State University and graduated with a bachelor's in science degree. For the first half of her career, she managed the Wicker Picker, a local home decor and florist shop where she was beloved by both the customers and employees alike. She finished her career with the Florida Dept of Law Enforcement (FDLE) as an Operations Review Specialist in the budget office. She retired in November 2016. Ms. Foster was an animal lover. She served 4 years as secretary/treasurer for Its Meow or Never for Ferals (IMON) a local nonprofit working to reduce the population of community cats through education and facilitation of the humane practice of Trap, Neuter/spay, vaccinate and Return (TNR). She was an avid reader, enjoyed gardening, and was known for her infectious humor.

Ms. Foster is preceded in death by her parents, George Marvin Foster and Mabel Hurley; and her brother, George Everett Foster. She is survived by brother, Steve Foster.
